These instructions have been written to help you with the installation of your Borla Performance Exhaust System. Please read this document completely before beginning the installation of your system.

This Borla Performance Cat-Back™ Exhaust System (Part number 140498) is designed for the Volkswagen Golf R equipped with a 2.0L 4-cylinder turbo engine, AWD, and manual transmission.

Borla Performance Industries recommends that an exhaust shop or professional after market parts installer perform the installation of this system. However, if you decide to perform the installation on your own it is recommended that two people are used. This installation should not be performed by one person due to the risk of injury. Ensure the installers use all under car safety precautions including eye protection.








Caution!!! Never work on a hot exhaust system. Serious injury in the form of burns can result If the vehicle has been in use and the exhaust system is hot, allow vehicle to cool for at least 1 hour. Always wear eye protection when working under any vehicle.

Note: It is our recommendation that you use a hoist or hydraulic lift to facilitate the installation of your new Borla Performance Cat-BackTM Exhaust System.

Taking all under car safety precautions, lift the vehicle using a hoist or hydraulic lift. Once this has been done, you may begin the removal of your old exhaust system from your vehicle.

Note: Before removing the original exhaust system from your vehicle, please compare the parts you have received with the bill of materials provided on the previous page to assure that you have all the parts necessary for the installation of your new Borla Performance Cat-BackTM Exhaust System.




Original Exhaust System Removal


Note: With a used vehicle, we suggest a penetrating spray lubricant to be applied liberally to all exhaust fasteners and allowing a significant period of time for the chemical to lubricate the threads before attempting to disassemble


- 1. Loosen (2) bolts on cross-brace and drop-down for access to band clamp bolts. Loosen and remove the (2) 13mm bolts on band clamp and slide clamp towards front of vehicle. (See Fig. 1)
- 2. At muffler tip, locate and disconnect vacuum hose from muffler valve. Plug the end with a small screw and secure the hose using a zip-tie. (See Fig. 2)
- 3. Using a muffler stand or an additional person to hold the muffler assembly up into position, slide the (4) hangars out of the rubber isolators and remove the system from the rear. (See Fig. 3) Keep the hardware for use during the installation of your new exhaust system.
- 4. Exhaust system comparison, Borla vs stock. (Figure 4)

Warning: Use extreme caution during installation. Torque all fasteners according to manufacturer's torque values and tightening sequence. <u>DO NOT</u> use air impact tools to tighten fasteners on Borla Performance Exhaust Systems. Use of such tools may result in bent flanges or gasket contact areas leading to exhaust leaks.












Borla Performance Cat-Back TM Exhaust System Installation

- 1. Place the Accuseal clamp over the Muffler Assembly. Orient and position the Muffler Assembly over the OE pipe and connect the hangars into the OE rubber hangar. (See Fig. 4) DO NOT tighten the clamp bolt.
- 2. Place the Accuseal clamp over the Tailpipe Assembly and insert into the Front Muffler Assembly and connect the hangars into the OE rubber hangar. Re install bolts to the cross brace. (See Figs. 5 & 6) DO NOT tighten the clamp bolt.
- 3. NOTE: When properly clamped, the Accuseal pipe closes in a circular-shape with interlocking notches creating a proper seal. The pipe will distort or ovalize in shape if the clamp-bolt is positioned over the notches.



- 4. Check your exhaust system for proper clearance under the vehicle and also for tip alignment. Once position has been determined to be correct, tighten the Accuseal™ clamp bolts to 32-35 ft. lbs. (See Fig. 7)
- 5. Before starting your vehicle, make sure to check all wires, hoses, brake lines, body parts and tires for safe clearance from the exhaust system.
- Start vehicle and check for any leaks. If any leaks are found, determine cause (such as loose or incorrectly positioned clamp) and repair as necessary.

Note: When you first start your vehicle after the installation of your new Borla Performance Exhaust System, there may be some smoke and fumes coming from the system. This is a protective oil based coating used in the manufacturing of mandrel bent performance exhaust tubing. This is not a problem and will disappear within a very short period of time after the exhaust has reached normal operating temperatures.
